On behalf of the Wine Committee I am delighted to introduce to you the University Club of Toronto's wine list.

May I begin by offering a warm welcome to our members and guests to the delights of the University Club's wine cellar. There are many benefits to being a member of the club, and one of the distinct pleasures we suggest you take advantage of is the enjoyment of fine wines at unusually good – let's say unheard of – pricing.

We have adopted a wine pricing policy for the sale of wines in the bar and dining room which limits the mark up to a \$20 maximum. This provides an opportunity to sample some excellent wines that you may not have had an opportunity to purchase at home, with it being an affordable pleasure.

To give you an example of how this compares to local restaurants in Toronto, a bottle of Chateau Palmer 1982 sells in our dining room for \$280 while the price at three leading restaurants in Toronto with sizeable cellars: Restaurant #1: \$560; Restaurant #2: \$620; Restaurant #3 \$600.

We hope that you enjoy all the benefits the Club has to offer – a wonderful meal prepared by Chef Patrick Desmoulins accompanied by the best quality and value provided by our expansive cellar.

Gruaud-Larose (2ieme Cru Classé) (St. Julien) <i>There seems to be no doubt about the quality of the 1986 Gruaud-Larose, which in 20 years should rival the extraordinary 1990, 1982, 1961, 1949, and 1928 made at this vast estate. From the first time I tasted this wine in cask, I have thought it to be among the blockbusters of the vintage. It has a black/purple color, mammoth structure, a fabulous wealth of fruit, and a finish that seems to last several minutes. This is indeed first-growth quality, but then, when, in the last decade, has a Gruaud-Larose not matched the quality of the first-growths? Score 94 – Robert Parker</i>	1986	292.00 *
R15	Ch. Cos d'Estournel (2ieme Cru Classé) (St. Estèphe) <i>The 1988 has an intriguing bouquet of exotic spices and black fruits. Savagely tannic in its youth, the wine has softened and developed more charm and appeal. Still deep ruby/purple in color, with little signs of age, this medium-bodied, slightly austere wine possesses good cassis fruit, excellent purity, and an elegant, classic style. R53	Ch. Ducru Beaucaillou (2ieme Cru Classé) (St. Julien)	1989	286.00 *
R31	Ch. Gruaud-Larose (2ieme Cru Classé) (St. Julien) <i>Gruaud-Larose was superb at the most recent tasting. Moreover, this might be a 1990 that is still affordable. The wine exhibits a thick-looking, plum/purple/garnet-like color. A sensational nose of jammy black-cherries, earth, cedar, and herbs has become far more intense and striking. The wine displays sensational richness and power, but not quite the burly, monstrous size and hulking weight of the 1986 or 1982. Yet it reveals impressive stuffing and power. The low acidity emphasizes the thick, juicy, succulent fruit in this backward yet rich, chewy wine. This was the finest showing yet for the 1990 Gruaud Larose. R156	Ch. Gruaud-Larose (2ieme Cru Classé) (St. Julien) <i>Robert Parker's Wine Spectator: 90 points</i> <i>This has a Gruaud signature etched onto its enticing, rich and decadent nose. This is a superb example of Bordeaux and particular St Julien at its very best. Really silky and creamy on the palate with a fabulously exotic, powerful, ripe and sweet black/red fruit core. Long finish and very classy indeed. Medium to full bodied with pure, rich blackcurrent flavours, liquorice and herbs. A very elegant wine, steering away from the massive, muscular styles provided by many other Chateaux in '96.</i>	1996	148.00 *
R147	Ch. Palmer (3ieme Cru Classé) (Margaux) <i>This wine, a blend of 55% Cabernet Sauvignon, 40% Merlot, and 5% Petit Verdot, is performing well after its July, 1998 bottling. It boasts an impressively saturated purple color, in addition to a backward yet intense nose of black plums, currants, licorice, and smoke. Following terrific fruit on the attack, the wine's structure and tannin take over. There is plenty of sweet fruit, and the tannin is well-integrated, but the wine requires 7-8 years of cellaring. Anticipated maturity: 2007-2028. Score 91, Robert Parker.</i>	1996	269.00 *
R80	Mouton-Rothschild Grand Cru Classé (Pauillac) <i>Wine Advocate Score: 94 Maturity 2007-2030. Cabernet Sauvignon 77%, Cabernet Franc 13%, Merlot 10%. From magnum. This wine has a superb colour compared to the maturing wines tasted alongside; it has a dark core, a dense rim, with plenty of red pigment still. This is very impressive. The nose here is divine; it has a very typical profile for the vintage, full of iron and rust, but enticingly perfumed with violets. It kicks off very elegantly on the palate, and it has a wonderful texture, composed rather than showy. It has great style; the tannins and acidity show through and there is plenty of perfumed character as there is on the nose. There is structure and grip, and a fine persistence. This very superb wine, with its reserved character, will go for more than ten years yet. R106	Ch. Cheval-Blanc 1er Grand Cru Classé A (Saint Emilion) <i>Cheval-Blanc, one of the greatest wines of Bordeaux, is a blend of Cabernet Franc and Merlot. Robert Parker rated this vintage of Cheval-Blanc at 90-92 points, and claims that the wine has "undeniable seductiveness".</i>	1997	225.00 *

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R138	Ch. Latour Grand Cru Classé (Pauillac) <i>Steven Tanzer IWC: Red-ruby. Deep aromas of cassis, licorice and lead pencil. R137	Ch. Figeac Grand Cru (Saint Emilion) <i>International Wine Cellar: Full medium ruby. Rich, new-oaky nose of raspberry, cedar and coffee shows an almost liqueur-like sweetness. Dense, sweet and refined, with superb richness for Figeac. Still quite youthful. Finishes with huge but fine oak-influenced tannins and excellent persistence. Score 92</i> <i>Wine Spectator: A wine in harmony. Extremely bright aromas of black cherry, berry and plum. R148	Ch. Léoville Barton (St. Julien) <i>Châteaux Léoville-Barton is one of Bordeaux's stars. Located in the commune of St. Julien, it is ranked as one of the top chateaux in Bordeaux. It carries a 2nd growth (Deuxieme Cru) designation within the 1855 Bordeaux Classification system but is regarded by many now as a "super second" because of its steady improvement in quality for the past 2 decades. Jancis Robinson gives the estate an 18/20 – only 0.5 lower than her rankings of the chateaux of Lafite-Rothschild and Latour which are 1st Growths. Decanter (English wine magazine) rates it 5/5 and Wine Spectator magazine(USA) gives it 92-94/100.</i>	1998	106.00	*
R149	Ch. Berliquet, Grand Cru Classé (St. Julien) <i>Decanter Magazine gives this vintage a 5/5 and the Wine Spectator ranks it 90-94 points</i> <i>Robert Parker: "The finest Berliquet I have tasted to date, this dark ruby/purple-colored offering exhibits dense, saturated, flavorful black cherry notes intermixed with licorice, spice box, tobacco, and earth. R129	Ch. de Pez Cru Bourgeois (St. Estèphe) <i>Created in the 15th Century, Chateau de Pez is the oldest domaine in Saint-Estephe. Château Tour de Pez is perfectly balanced, with intense aromas of blackcurrant, cherry, spices and fresh grapes. Power and volume characterise this wine. R154	Ch. Leoville Las Cases (St. Julien) <i>"The 1998 has turned out to be one of the vintage's superb Medocs. R153	Ch. Palmer Alter Ego <i>Château Palmer, one of the great estates in Bordeaux, has 130 acres of vineyards in the village of Margaux. Classified as a third growth in the Médoc Classification of 1855, it makes better wine than that 19th century ranking indicates. In some years Palmer outshines its first growth neighbor, Château Margaux. Second wines from top-notch properties such as Château Margaux or Château Palmer are excellent deals for consumers. While they never will develop the complexity and class of the property's grand vin (first wine), they are ready to drink far sooner, and typically sell for a fraction of the price.</i>	1999	88.00	*

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R158	Ch. Pavie (St. Emilion) Magnum <i>The inky/ruby/purple-colored 1999 exhibits a tight but promising nose of crushed stones, a liqueur of blackberries, cherries, and black currants, and subtle smoke and licorice in the background. Powerful, with impressive elegance, fine harmony among its elements, a multi-layered texture, it has a finish that lasts for 50+ seconds. There is considerable tannin, but it is well-integrated. Give it 3-4 years, and drink it over the next two decades. A profound effort for the vintage, it is an example of a perfectionist proprietor pushing the envelope of quality.</i> <i>"The 1999 Pavie is a candidate for "wine of the vintage". It boasts an opaque ruby/purple color in addition to gorgeous aromas of crushed minerals, smoke, licorice, cherry liqueur, and black currants. The wine is exceptionally pure and multilayered, with stunning texture and overall balance. The tannin level suggests 3-4 years of cellaring is warranted; it should age gracefully for 25+ years. PORT & MADEIRA

PORT

Port is a fortified wine made in Portugal from various grape varieties grown in the Douro valley. Brandy is added to halt fermentation at a point where sufficient natural sugar remains to give the wine its characteristic sweetness. There are many different types of port. Vintage port is wine of an exceptional year, kept in cask for two or three years, then matured in bottles. Late Bottled Vintage (LBV) ports are generally the produce of a single vintage. They are left in wood for four to six years, then fined and filtered before bottling. Ruby port, generally a blend of wines of different vintages, is stored in wood and bottled before it loses its clear, red color. Vintage Character port is essentially premium ruby port. Tawny port remains longer in the cask, losing some color and alcohol. Colheita is a tawny port from a single vintage. Crusted port is vintage or ruby port kept in bottles until it has formed a crust-like sediment. Single Quinta Ports are made in both tawny and vintage styles but with the distinction that they come from only one vineyard. White port is a sweet, amber-coloured port that is delicious served chilled as an aperitif.

MADEIRA

Madeira is a fortified wine that comes from an island off the northwest coast of Africa of the same name. Originally it was naturally oxidized as a result of ageing on shipboard. This process, which produces strong, rich wines, is now undertaken in heated buildings called "estufas," Madeira ranges from very sweet (Malmsey) to medium sweet (Bual) to rather dry (Verdelho and Sercial).
